ARMY ROTC Scholarship

The high school Four-Year Scholarship is for high school students planning to attend a four-year college program. To qualify, you must be a U.S. citizen - Be between the ages of 17 and 26 - Have a high school GPA of at least 2.50 - Have a high school diploma or equivalent - Score minimum of 920 on the SAT (math/verbal) or 19 on the ACT (excluding the required writing test scores) - Meet physical standards - Agree to accept a commission and serve in the Army on Active Duty or in a Reserve Component (U.S. Army Reserve or Army National Guard) **DEADLINE: 1/4**

National MS Society Scholarship Program

The Society established its scholarship program in 2003, and the program continues to grow both in terms of support and scholarships awarded. In its first year of operation the program awarded 36 scholarships for a total of \$68,000; in 2007 we awarded \$700,440 to 332 students, with awards ranging from \$1,000 to \$3,000. An additional \$21,000 was awarded to the two top scholars as four-year awards; **MUST HAVE MS OR CHILD OF A PARENT WITH MS. Families of Freedom Scholarship Fund

To provide education assistance for post-secondary study to dependents of those killed or permanently disabled as a result of the terrorist attacks on 9/11 and during the rescue activities relating to those attacks. The student must be a dependent child or spouse of a person directly affected by the attacks and currently enrolled or planning to enroll at a college, university, or vocational school in the US.
