Dear Piscataway High School Students & Families,

Once again, Piscataway Township Schools will be offering the PSAT 8/9 to current 9th graders & the PSAT/NMSQT to current 10th & 11th graders, free of charge, on Wednesday, October 11th, 2023. Read the information below carefully, as it will explain what you need to do before the test, what you must do on the day of the test, & what to do if you are a senior student.

Before Arrival

Students & their families should review the resources posted on our [webpage](#) regarding the College Board exam. There you will find links to the College Board's PSAT site – in English & Spanish – including practice tests, what to bring on test day & other important information. Now, the PSAT is digital. Therefore, before October 4th, students need to download Blue Book testing application from their Jamf student portal. Directions will be posted to Schoology.

What to Bring

- All students must bring their district issued, charged & up-to-date iPad, running iOS 16.7 or higher, with Blue Book testing application already downloaded onto their iPad.
- If a student hasn't done so already, they should create a College Board account using an email address & password that they will remember.
- Calculators are available in Blue Book app. If students want to bring their own [non-graphing calculator](#), they may do so.

Pencils & scratch paper will be provided for all students. Students will be asked to turn off their electronic devices, including smart watches & phones, storing them in their backpack in the front of their testing room. Students are permitted to bring a drink & a small, clear bag containing a snack. Eat a hearty breakfast & get a good night's sleep. The test itself takes about 2 hours & 15 minutes. Arrival

ALL 9th, 10th, & 11th Grade Students:

- Students will report directly to their testing location by 7:15am.
- Locations will be listed by student ID# & posted around school. Students can also find their testing room locations in their Schoology class groups 1 week before exam date.

12th Grade Students:

- Seniors will arrive on a delayed opening schedule. Busses will be provided for bussed students only. Seniors need to be at their bus stop no later than 9am.

- Seniors will report directly to the Performing Arts Center (PAC) in the Patton building no later than 9:30am. There, we will meet & go over important senior year information such as ordering caps & gowns.

After the Test

Upon completion of the PSAT, testing materials will be collected & secured & students will be dismissed based on an abbreviated schedule, which will be posted to Schoology. It will be an A day.
