After weeks of competing against over 500 teams state-wide, PHS FBLA sent 13 teams to the semi-final round of Junior Achievement's TITAN competition, held at premier corporate locations around Central and Northern New Jersey. TITAN is a business simulation where members make pricing, R&D, and other decisions, and a computer-run algorithm compares them other teams' to determine a performance index (PI). The team with the highest PI wins. We're thrilled that Adam Liang, Kunal Thakker, and Adam Nathoo (a/k/a "Team AKA") earned a spot in the final round where the top prize is \$1000. In addition to the competition, teams heard from top executives and other managers at the host companies on selecting colleges, choosing majors, and developing relationships that will lead to careers.

Rotary Club of Piscataway Hosts Business Plan Simulation Competition



For too many years to count, the Rotary Club of Piscataway has hosted a Business Plan Competition in the PHS Library. Over 20 participating students, working in teams with volunteer Rotarians serving as advisors, purchase a business, learn to analyze a profit and loss (P&L) statement, and make difficult decisions. The competition ends with presentations to actual bankers from the Piscataway area, who decide which team has the most viable plan. Graduates of this event have gone on to win state- and national-level awards at FBLA competitions. 
Region 2 Ensembles
